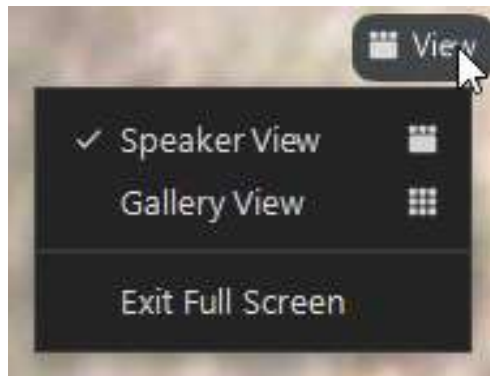

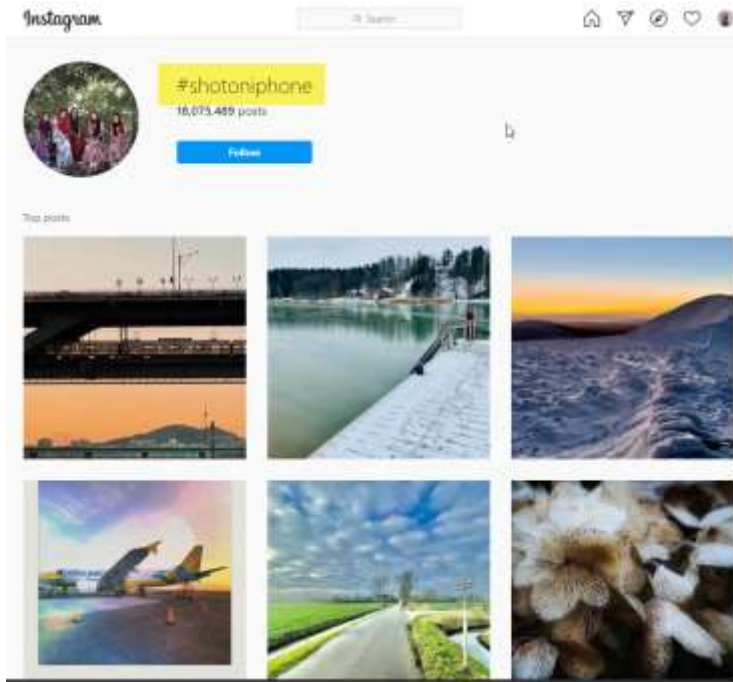

Launching The Camera App



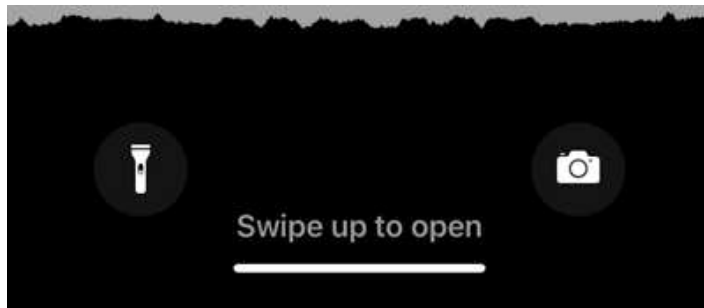
Launch the Camera App

1. Tap on Camera App icon
2. Long Press for Shortcuts



Launch the Camera from the Lock Screen

1. Long Press Camera icon on Lock screen



2. Swipe Left

From the Control Center

- Tap Camera icon

- Long Press on the Control Center



Ask Siri

- Take a Photo/Picture
- Take a Selfie



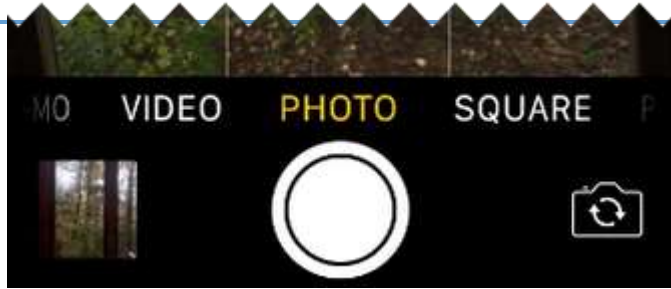
In an App

Look for a Camera icon
in apps like:

- Messages
- Notes
- Social Media



Eight Ways to Release the Shutter





2. Volume Buttons
3. Earbud Volume Buttons
4. Apple Watch
5. Accessory

Eight Ways to Release the Shutter

6. Burst Photos

- Press and Hold Shutter
- iPhone 11 +
- Swipe (Shift) Shutter to Left

7. Timer

- Older iPhone: Tap 
- iPhone 11+ : Tap ^ then 
- Chose 3 or 10 secs
- Tap Shutter to start timer



Eight Ways to Release the Shutter

8. Quick Take Video (iPhone 11+)

- In Photo mode, Touch & Hold Shutter to take quick video

Slide Shutter to right for hands-free recording with both Record and Photo button



Useful Accessories

Accessories that I use and Recommend

- Tripods
- Device holders
- Remote Shutter
